The first and biggest is that the Session has voted to extend a call to our Assistant Pastor Candidate, Charles Reed. And Charles has accepted! In the EPC denomination, an Assistant Pastor is called by the Session for a particular job focus and for a particular length of time. The Session has called Charles to serve as our Pastor for Youth and Family Ministries, and his contract will be renewable annually. This is an exciting time in the life of HPC! Please share your love and thanks with our Assistant Pastor Search Team when you have a moment. They have presented us with an amazing candidate to join our ministry team here at HPC! You will hear information about an upcoming Congregational Meeting at which you will be presented the terms of call for Rev. Charles Reed and be asked to vote on them. We are excited to have Charles and his family joining our church family beginning in July! Please make plans to welcome them, take them to lunch, send encouraging cards, and such. We want them to know how special of a place it is here at HPC! And please plan to attend the congregational meeting, as we will also be approving the Officer Nominating Committee for 2022.

Another change which has taken place is upon Peter Sul's departure, Tim Stark stepped in as our Interim Facilities Manager. Tim and his wife, Lynette, have been here for a few years now, and Tim recently joined HPC just a few months ago. Tim is learning the position and will be working with us until we find and hire a new Facilities Manager. We are so thankful for Tim's investment in the church during this time of transition. He is already doing a great job filling the gap while we search for the person God has prepared to join our team here at HPC.

As we say goodbye to Michele Revis, we are also welcoming our new Director of Creative Beginnings Christian Preschool, Katrina Bowen. Katrina is a college professor who has served with CBCPS as an assistant teacher, a lead teacher, a parent board member in the past. Now she will be serving as the new Director. She brings a very different gift set to the position than both Fran Rochester and Michele Revis so please don't try to compare her to those wonderful leaders from our past. Katrina is very committed to finding ways to work with Stacy McClelland, Charles Reed and our Children's and Family Ministry here at HPC to reach parents and families with the good news of Jesus Christ both in the church and in the community. You will hear many new ideas coming out of that wing of the church, and hopefully see many new faces coming into worship over the next few years from that ministry! Katrina will start June 1, 2022, and we would love for you to stop by and share the love of HPC with her, as she jumps in with both feet to grow and change our Preschool Ministry.

Change is Happening! And it is EXCITING! I hope you are as excited as I am about the new Team Members God has provided for our team here at HPC.

As one of my favorite theologians once wrote, "The idea was to bring together a group of remarkable people to see if they could become something more." (Stan Lee). ## Session Highlights - May 18, 2022

*The complete minutes of session meetings are posted on the Session Bulletin Board in the Fellowship Hall as soon as they are approved.*

Nine of twelve elders were present with Deacon representative, Roy Hathaway, and non-session members of the Pastor Search Committee: Laura Morris, Bill Jones, and Betty Muller.

The Pastor Search Committee (PSC) recommended Rev. Charles Reed as Youth and Family Pastor. Rev. Reed has served as senior, solo pastor in Warm Springs, Virginia for twelve years, several of those as a dual vocation or tent-maker pastor. He is currently taking a sabbatical from ministry working full-time as a chemical engineer. The search committee is recommending that he be hired by the session on a contract basis (a 1-to-3-year contract) as part-time Youth and Family Pastor. According to the Terms of Call, he would serve 30 hours a week and preach at least ten times a year, at a salary of \$55,000 broken down into \$13,000 in salary and \$42,000 as housing allowance. There will be none of the usual benefits with this part-time position, as he is already receiving benefits in his other position.

A session interview was deemed done during the weekend visit April 26-27 when Rev. Reed with his family met session members, interacted with our youth, and preached at both services. Rev. Reed is already a member of our presbytery and has been approved by our presbytery's Committee on Ministry, pending the submission of his Terms of Call. The final requirement is that the Terms of Call be approved by the congregation. June 19 was set for a congregational meeting to vote on both his Terms of Call and for the election of this year's Officer Nominating Committee.

Deacon Roy Hathaway reported on the Deacons' continuing study of the book *Kingdom Come*, and urged people to contact him for any needs that might be handled by the Fix-It-Friends.

The Pastor will be in Greece June 1-18. During his absence, Elder John Van Wagoner will preach on June 5 at 9:00 am and Dwayne Durham at 11:00. Grant Sitler has agreed to preach at both services on June 12.

Finance Committee reported that in spite of Easter falling in April, it had not been a particularly strong month, which is unusual. This may indicate the financial difficulties in the country are hitting our members. Income is still ahead of expenses by \$25,000 for the year.

Facilities Committee's Clay Haskins received approval of \$5,536 from Building Designated Fund to do repair and insulation work in the sanctuary attic on the air ducts to stop the condensation causing ceiling paint peeling in the sanctuary. The roof ridge cap is slowly being handled.

Outreach Ministry's Refugee Resettlement Task Force will enter into a partnership with Grace Blue Ridge Church, PCA with the goal of sponsoring one or more refugees or a refugee family. These may end up being Afghan refugees or a Ukrainian family. They will present their plan to the congregation and solicit interested members and visitors to the church to assist in the needed refugee interface.

Discipleship Ministry's John Van Wagoner and the Pastor reported on how impressed they had been by the observations and proposals offered by our new Director of Creative Beginnings, Katrina Bowen, as she begins her time with us as our Director.

Member Life Ministry's Sara Emel reported on the plans for the new Pictorial Directory, headed up by Jessica Wallace, who is going to use the youth to help take selfies with members' phones.

Currently, the only thing with which they still really need help is cookie bakers for the Fellowship Hours.

Worship Ministry's Andy Morris reported that they have been attempting to find volunteers who might be willing to live stream the 9:00 a.m. service.

## REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT TASK FORCE

Hands on ministry opportunity.  
Refugee resettlement

Some months ago, the local missions committee was made aware of an invitation for local churches to assist in helping Afghan refugees who have been displaced from their homes resettle in the United States through our partner, Samaritan's Purse. A Refugee Resettlement Task Force was formed to explore this opportunity to love these asylees in Jesus' Name by helping a family resettle in Hendersonville.

Since our initial meetings, the Afghan refugee influx is slowing because many have already been resettled in this country, but the Ukrainian refugee need is increasing. We don't know at this time whom the Lord will send, but we are making preparations to be approved as a sponsoring church in partnership with Grace Blue Ridge Church (PCA).

Major tasks will include locating housing, orientation to Hendersonville, learning English, transportation for needed services, help finding work, and signing up for various benefits. Samaritan's Purse will assist us along the way. Our required commitment will be from 3 to 6 months, but we foresee possibly being involved with this family for longer.

Is this an area of mission that stirs your heart? Is the Lord calling you to take part in this humanitarian effort in some way?





# MISSIONARY CARE COMMITTEE

STEVE and MARGIE DOTY

WICLIFFE BIBLE TRANSLATORS

SOUTHEAST ASIA AND USA (HOUGHTON COLLEGE, NY)

Since the Dotys were last featured in our Church's Update they have visited with us. It is always enjoyable to get reacquainted with our church's missionaries and this visit was also enjoyable. Since that visit they have returned to their home base of Houghton College in Houghton, New York. While they have been there they have offered their services gratis to Houghton College teaching in the Linguistics department. Their goal is to again build up Houghton's program of Bible translation that will send out more workers for the Wycliffe Bible Translators and other translation ministries.



In addition to teaching these courses at Houghton they both have been supporting ongoing programs they were presenting at Payap University, the first Christian University in Thailand. Steve heads the translation department teaching courses and overseeing translation teams as they work with new Bible translations for countries without a written language. He has been accomplishing this via Skype, Zoom, or another streaming services. This is a complicated task because the teams are made up of several members spanning several countries, time zones, and newly written languages.

Margie also has a similar assignment with teams proofreading new translations for accuracy. Like Steve's groups these can be gathered in different countries until the task is done, and then they relocate to a new location (possible new time zone, etc.) and start over with a new Bible Book and new translation.

One different translation task that one of Steve's students undertook was to translate the Bible into sign language for deaf people. Because this is not written the translator "signs the translation which is then recorded on video. The hardest part is translating emotions into sign language.

Steve and Margie have continued to intersperse their teaching with trips connecting with supporters across the country. They have also enjoyed getting together with their adult children when an opportunity allows.

The Dotys began their translation work in the Solomon Islands, followed by a three year assignment at Houghton College recruiting and training Bible Translators. They have partnered with us since 1997. Next they were sent to Kenya for a four year assignment and then to their current assignment in Thailand which has lasted 18 years. Covid grounded them in Houghton and currently they conduct their Asian assignments remotely and teach their Houghton classes in person whenever restrictions allow.

## Designated Fund for Missionary Care and Local Missions

In September of 2013 the Endowment for Mission Support was created to replace the no longer available Lovett Fund. Each year a small portion of the proceeds of this fund is reinvested to continue growing the fund. The majority of the proceeds are evenly divided between the Missionary Care Designated Fund and the Local Church Missions Fund. The only source of monies now for missionary transportation costs for Table Talks or to preach; shortfalls; or special needs not covered by the church's annual Benevolence support, is from the Missionary Care Designated Fund.

When Henderson County organizations our church supports through Local Missions are in need of extra monies for their support, the only source is the Local Missions Designated Fund.


How can it be June already?! The temperatures are rising and vacation time is here!

## Interesting Facts about Father's Day

Father's Day is a holiday of honoring fatherhood and paternal bonds, as well as the influence of fathers in society. In Catholic countries of Europe, it has been celebrated on March 19 as Saint Joseph's Day since the Middle Ages.

In the United States, it wasn't until July 5, 1908, that the first Father's Day (that we know about) was celebrated. A West Virginia church sponsored the nation's first event explicitly in honor of fathers, a Sunday sermon in memory of 362 men who had died in the previous December's explosions at the Fairmont Coal Company mines in Monongah, but it was a one-time commemoration and not an annual holiday.

The next year, a Spokane, Washington, woman named Sonora Smart Dodd, one of six children raised by a widower, tried to establish an official equivalent to Mother's Day for male parents. She went to local churches, the YMCA, shopkeepers and government officials to drum up support for her idea, and she was successful: Washington State celebrated the nation's first statewide Father's Day on June 19, 1910.

However, it was not until 58 years after President Woodrow Wilson made Mother's Day official (in 1914)—that the day honoring fathers became a nationwide holiday in the United States. It was in 1972, in the middle of a hard-fought presidential re-election campaign, that Richard Nixon signed a proclamation making Father's Day a federal holiday at last.

Father's Day 2022 will occur on Sunday, June 19.
