LIFE OF ELIJAH: A study by Bill Jones "God's Sure Word Amidst Angry Kings and Dry Brooks"

1 Kings 17:1-7

7 Points from the Perfect Word of God:

I. God's word is sure, we can count on it.

(1 Kings 16:34; 17:1-2,8,16,24)

II. God's word is living and real, while man made gods are no gods at all.

(1 Kings 17:1 Exodus 20:4-5, Job 19:25, Malachi 3:10, Matthew 6:24,33; 10:37-38, Acts 17:16,23-29; 19:26, Romans 1:25, Ephesians 5:5, 1 Thessalonians 1:8-9)

III. God's word is not to be ignored, it is to be believed.

(1 Kings 16:34, 17:1, Deuteronomy 11:16-21; 28:22-24, Leviticus 26:19-20, 2 Samuel 7:25, Isaiah 30:20-22, John 14:15, Romans 10:17)

IV. God's word has multiple benefits, but first it must be obeyed.

(1 Kings 17:2-4 John 14:23-24; 15:7,10, Acts 9:5-6)

A. God preserves His word and protects us.

(1 Kings 17:4, Ephesians 6:10-17)

Analogy: God preserved Elijah, and God preserves His word.

B. If we question or ignore God's word, it will become rare in our lives.

(1 Kings 17:2-3, 1 Samuel 3:1, Amos 8:11-12)

Analogy: God sent Elijah to seclusion, and God secluded His word.

C. God's word prepares us for His service.

(Genesis 39:6-20, Exodus 2:15, Matthew 4:1-11, Mark 1:12-13, Luke 4:1-12, Acts 7:29-30, Romans 12:1, Galatians 1:15-17, Ephesians 6:7, Philippians 3:4-6)

Analogy: God uses Elijah in the life of the widow, and God's word is living and always actively at work. (Hebrews 4:12)

Analogy: Elijah ministered to the widow, a Gentile, and God's word is for all people.

V. God's word overrules everything else, He is in control of nature.

(1 Kings 17:6, Leviticus 11:13-15, Deuteronomy 14:11-14, Psalm 76:10, 1 Corinthians 1:27-31)

Analogy: God overrules the basic nature of ravens, and God overrules our basic sin nature.

VI. God's word provides life and sustenance, it is the bread of life.

(1 Kings 17:4-6, Deuteronomy 8:3, Matthew 4:4, Luke 4:4, John 1:1; 6:35,48)

Analogy: God provided food for Elijah in the morning and evening, and we need to spend time in God's word (the bread of life) in the morning and evening.

VII. God's word never fails, our trust must be in Him.

(1 Kings 17:7, Psalm 130:5, Isaiah 40:1; 49:14-16; 55:11, John 4:13-14, James 5:17)

How do we try to minimize the importance of the word of God in our day?

How will a right view of the warnings and promises of God affect your personal prayer life? Your work and home? Your sharing of Christ with others? Your impact on society?
