

Session Highlights, July 19, 2021

The complete minutes of session meetings are posted on the Session Bulletin Board in the Fellowship Hall as soon as they are approved.

The July Session meeting on Zoom was held July 19 and attended by ten elders, Pastor Rob and our Treasurer, Larry Mobley.

After the opening prayer, we had an update on the relaunch of the Blue Grass Bash and heard it was a joyful time with 150+ in attendance. We thank everyone who faithfully sets up the Fellowship Hall, serves ice cream and cookies, and welcomes our guests.

Pastor Rob reported that membership on the Search Committee for an Assistant Minister is nearly complete. He has spoken with all nominees and expects to have the committee completed very soon. He will meet with the committee and provide them with the appropriate paperwork and guidance to begin their search.

In a second item of business the pastor educated the Session on how they would interface with those folks who have expressed a desire to join our church. Session members would be meeting with them individually to hear their faith story. This also allows the new member to have personal contact with the session members. The Inquirers/ New Member class on July 19th was well attended.

Larry Mobley gave our finance report saying the church is in good shape. He asked all committees to start the planning process for the 2022 budget in August. He will supply the necessary paperwork needed to begin the process. Session will look at preliminary figures in September and go from there.

Administration-Clay Haskins presented facts and figures on the purchase of a minibus to replace our aging van. He told session members that used vans are scarce and sell quickly when they come on the market. Following discussion, a motion to purchase a new minibus was made. A portion of the cost will be underwritten by a generous member and the remainder will be raised.

Discipleship had two action items brought to session by John Van Wagoner: The first was to move oversight of small groups from Member Life to Discipleship. Motion passed. The second item was to allow the Youth to host the Apple Festival parking lot. This item was amended to allow OCC and Boy Scouts to co-host if they so desired. Motion passed. Discipleship will coordinate. Please contact John.

Personnel Ministry welcomed our new bookkeeper, Leslie McCreary, who is taking Rick Stewart's place. We thank Rick for a job well done.

The Session approved a one-time bonus for Pastor Rob on his one year anniversary in appreciation for his efforts and service to HPC during a very difficult year.

No clerk's report was given. We pray that our clerk Mimi Jamieson will have swift and complete recovery.

Dorothy Managan Honored for World War II Era Service

Our own Dorothy Managan was among three Hendersonville World War II veterans who were honored for their service in a unique way.

The three were given specially chosen hand-knitted prayer shawls by knitters of Sacred Heart Catholic Church Ladies' Guild who made the warm, comforting and colorful shawls. Guild member Maggie DiRocco presented the shawls on July 21 just prior to a program entitled "Little Known Facts About World War II," sponsored by the Veterans History Musem of the Carolinas and presented by recent Brevard College history major, Sam Hipp.

Dorothy served as a US Army Nurse during the war. She was assigned to Fort Lewis Hospital in Washington State.

"I became the head of one of the wards for our own military personnel who had been prisoners of war," she said. "They were coming back on ships from Bataan, Corregidor, Burma and China. They were so happy to be back in the United States, and what they needed were hugs and a lot of tender loving care. Some were amputees, some were malnourished, some were not able to use limbs and some had chronic diseases. They had lot of different problems they had not been getting any treat-



ment for. The patients who had been prisoners of war were there at Fort Lewis until they were transferred back to Army hospitals closer to where they lived, where their family was. I have a lot of good memories of those times."

Congratulations, Dorothy, and many thanks to you and all our members and friends who served in World War II.


This is not my usual column, reviewing new books for our church library. This article is about change. Instead of telling you about a wonderful book, I am saying I am retiring from being the church librarian.

MISSIONARY CARE COMMITTEE REV. PHILLIP BARON CRU (Formerly Campus Crusade for Christ) Based in North Carolina

Rev. Phillip Baron, an Asheville, North Carolina native, joined Campus Crusade for Christ (now CRU) and went to the Philippines in the 1980s. He began partnering with us in 1985. By then he had married Rachel, another CRU worker, and they worked across the whole country. They expanded their field to all of Southeast Asia, where they mentored and coached the CRU campus leaders and become very proficient in evangelizing non-believing students, while raising up very dedicated student leaders.



In 2013, Phillip became a member of the CRU Global Campus Team traveling to countries around Southeast Asia and all over the world, training staff in "Catalytic Strategy" geared toward expansion in which one staff member could work with students from many universities eventually becoming small teams in every university seeking to reach the campus for Christ.

In 2016, Phillip and Rachel were working with team leaders all across the world. Since the US Global Campus Team's headquarters is in Orlando, Florida, they moved to Charlotte, North Carolina to be near their children.

On a return trip from North Africa in 2017, Rachel was diagnosed with colon cancer from which she evernually passed away in September 2019. During her ministry, Rachel raised up many disciples who honor her legacy by pursuing their calling all over the world.

As witness to God's healing power, Philip wrote in February 2021, "Around the 4th of July, I met Sandy who is from Rock Hill, South Carolina. She was a strong Christian who valued family and was involved with CRU as a student at Clemson and then a student leader at Winthrop. We had many things in common and shared the same values. We became engaged and then married on Dec 12, 2020."

The COVID-19 pandemic has caused changes and re-evaluations about the direction of Philip's ministry. In April, Phillip wrote: "In CRU, we have 4 main ministry strategies, with Campus Ministry being one; another is Church Movements. In the US, Church Movements involves training churches on evangelism and discipleship with the goal of reaching out to a geographic or demographic focus. It also trains for church planting, which I was personally involved in as well as training churches during my many years overseas. I have also started a church movement among unchurched universities.

"At this point in my life, I believe God is calling me to shift from the campus to church, but still live in Charlotte. I am still with CRU, but my target audience is church leaders and members."

Philip's letter continues:"On a side note, our Charlotte campus team has been using Instagram to find new students. We don't use our personal name for the account, but MetroCharlotteCru or the name of an individual university. The Instagram account is updated weekly with articles, videos and has pictures of who we are and what we are about. Then we go to hashtags for freshmen and like their Instagram profile. If they tag us back, we ask them to look at our page and what do they like about it. Then we ask them if they are interested in knowing more about who we are."

Pray that God will lead Philip in the path of God's choosing, and that CRU will be successful in reaching people for Christ through campus ministry and other outreach programs around the world.

Designated Fund for Missionary Care and Local Missions

These two funds were established in September 2013 to replace the no longer available, long-standing Lovett Fund. The only source of monies now for missionary transportation costs for Table Talks or to preach; shortfalls; or special needs not covered by the church's annual Benevolence support, is from the Missionary Care Designated Fund.

When Henderson County organizations our church supports through Local Missions are in need of extra monies for their support, the only source is the Local Missions Designated Fund.
