In July, the Session had some exciting items brought for action. This is a bullet-point summary. Actual minutes can be found in the Fellowship Hall on the Session board, or in the front office. The Session...

- Moved forward to rectify concrete issues with the steeple, and roofing issues on the portico.
- Approved a Capital Campaign, which will begin the planning stage this fall.
- Approved upgrading security in the Children's and Creative Beginnings wing of the church.
- Decided to financially support elder Robert Wallace as he attends Seminary in Greenville, SC. Robert came under care of the Session last year, and we have been prayerfully discerning Robert's call to ministry with he and his wife, Jessica.
- Called a Session Retreat to be held August 4-5 continuing the process of rediscovery of who we are uniquely created to be as a Church. This will be pivotal in a multi-year process to rediscover the purpose, mission, vision, strategy, and values of HPC, along with what Metrics we will use to discern healthy growth going forward as the Church.

What is Stephen Ministry?

This is a question often asked by people in our congregation. Stephen Ministry is a proven and effective program to organize, equip, and supervise a team of congregation members to provide high-quality, one-to-one, Christ-centered care to people in the congregation and the community in a confidential manner. Stephen Ministers are lay congregation members trained to provide care to those experiencing a difficult time in life, such as grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or relocation. They come from all walks of life, but they all share a passion for bringing Christ's love and care to people during their time of need. They meet with their individual who is going through a difficult time on a weekly basis to listen, care, encourage, and provide emotional and spiritual support.

<u>Meet the Dotys!</u>

Steve and Margie Doty have made God accessible to many believers by giving them the written Word. A Wycliffe missionary takes on the difficult task of entering an area with no written language and with intense study and work brings about the translation of sounds into writing and composes a translation of the Bible from their local written language.

Our Church began partnering with Steve and Margie in 1997 while they were in Kenya. From there they were assigned to Thailand, their last assignment before Covid sent them to Houghton, N.Y. Steve and Margie met in the Philippines, where Steve was working. Once Margie graduated from Houghton, they were married and were given a joint assignment in the Solomon Islands. They have raised three children and been involved in translation tasks and translator recruitment. (Continued on page 7)



Operation Christmas Child

This month, our focus is on school supplies, much of which is on sale! Pencil sharpeners, crayons, erasers, small or medium note pads, spiral notebooks are a few suggestions. Remember, no company/product/military type logos please, and no liquids.

The \$641.84 collected July 16 with pennies for shoeboxes will be used for shipping costs, which are now \$10/box. The \$10 pays not only for the shipping to over 100 countries and to Native American Indian Reservations, but also pays for "The Greatest Gift" gospel booklets, collection center and processing costs, training in local churches, and the Ministry Partner Guide.

Here is one of the many stories from Samaritan's Purse coming out of Ukraine. People are seeing Christians in action, caring for the physical and spiritual well-being of both adults and children. "Everyone's life has been shaken, in the east, as well as the west of Ukraine," said Halya, an OCC international field representative. "The war has brought a longing to hear God's Word to find peace. People's hearts have been softened." "This is the time. We sense these are the last days," she continued. "We have to share the Gospel and have the zeal to preach it as quickly as possible and to use every opportunity we receive." Please pray that God would give Ukraine's Christian leaders wisdom and vision to know how to minister to children during and after the war.

Steve and Margie continued...

In Thailand, the Dotys work with Payap University, the first Christian University in Thailand. Steve teaches students how to create a written language and to translate scripture into that language. He assists them through the entire translation process. He also oversees the coordinators in the departments of Linguistics, Literacy, Translation, Language Learning, Language Survey, and Computing. In 2012, Margie became the Linguistics Institute Director for Thailand, while continuing to teach phonetics to new missionaries. Due to the rising danger for Americans in surrounding regions, Steve and Margie selected and trained local students to go into these regions and conduct the initial "sound into written language" studies and then bring the data back to the University.

During the pandemic, Steve and Margie remained at Houghton University where they took on the task of resurrecting the linguistics program as a gratis effort. They report that the program has begun to show some growth! Join us as we support God's work through prayer for Steve and Margie.
