Lighting of the Advent Candle Larry & Caryl Mobley
The Advent wreath includes many symbols. The wreath is in the circle, with no beginning and no ending. This reminds us that there is no beginning and no ending to God, and that God’s love and caring for us never ends. The green branches are a sign of ever new life. The candles tell us of the light shining into the world with Jesus Christ. The colors of the Advent candles remind us of our need for God’s help to be the people we should be. The white candle, which we light on Christmas Eve, signifies the birth of Jesus.

We light this candle, the candle of **Hope**, as a remembrance of the coming of the light of Christ and the new Hope that He brought into the world. The word Advent means “coming.” At the same time we are preparing ourselves for the future days of His coming, when the church together will cry out... Come Lord Jesus.

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with Hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.
