Prayer of Response

Almighty God, we need you to be present with us today. Draw near to all of us. There are many for whom the painful memories of Hurricane Helene do not feel as if they occurred one year ago, but just yesterday. We still grieve all that was lost – the loss of loved ones, the loss of homes, the loss of property, the loss of jobs, the loss of dreams, the loss of friends, the loss of cities. We grieve all that was lost directly and indirectly from the horrors of Helene. We still grieve the displacement of families and friends, the destruction of our communities and neighborhoods, and the suffering and trauma experienced by so many in our region.

Hear our cries, O God. Do not forsake us. As the prophet Isaiah proclaims: “You will be called Repairer of Broken Walls, Restorer of Streets with Dwellings.” Restore within us a deep love for neighbors and a renewed sense of community.

As we remember back to the days the floodwaters rose, the trees snapped or were uprooted, and the ground moved with landslides, Lord, help us remember how the nightmares gave way to a new day. We ask you, O God, to look gently on all the unveiled wounds of our humanity and gather the pieces of our shattered lives.

Hear our prayers, O God. Do not forsake us. As the prophet Jeremiah proclaims: “You will health to your people. You will heal our wounds.” Heal our emotional, mental, and physical wounds this day, we plead with you, O Lord.

May we raise an Ebenezer Stone, marking your faithfulness, O God. For you have brought us thus far, and we rejoice in your grace. For those who have seen your blessing, we rejoice with them. For those who are grieving loss, we grieve with them. For those who are stuck, and processing what had taken place, we come along side them and walk with them through the healing process. May you be glorified, O God, no matter where we are in the process.

Be glorified, O God! As the Apostle Peter proclaims, “The God of grace who called us into His eternal glory in Christ, after we have suffered, He will restore us, make us strong, firm and steadfast.” We ask for restoration and for strength so we might stand firm in Jesus!
