# DISCIPLESHIP Focus: Small Groups

### The Power of a Small Group:

There were 12 of us in a Membership Class together in 1987 who signed a covenant to set aside the next six weeks to make our small group meetings our top priority We picked out a book and then signed another 12-week covenant together. We never signed another covenant after that, but continued meeting for 32 years—through illnesses, deaths, grandbabies, weddings, graduations, etc. We consistently prayed and supported each other through the good times and the bad.

Consider these testimonials from various small groups in HPC history:

"For many years, we rotated around people's homes, with someone bringing dessert and another teaching the lesson. When several moved into Carolina Village, we ate dinner together and retired to a meeting room at CV for our lesson. We traveled to church conferences, annually tailgated to a Furman football game, and even did a couple days at the Masters practice round. Every fifth Thursday was a purely social gathering. We stayed basically the same group of people except for one couple who joined us for about eight years during all that time."-Saints and Sinners

"There were a varying and ever-changing membership in this small group—ladies coming and ladies going. We met at church twice a month for 16 years. We studied a wide array of books, but many were particularly geared toward women. We usually had a purely social summer picnic and a Christmas party."— Mary and Marthas

# Library News

There is good news for avid summer readers!

There's a new author in HPC town! Our member, RN Teresa Lyle, a college professor at North Greenville University, has recommended author Rose Senehi and her series of fiction books. Senehi has written many books of fiction that are set in the Blue Ridge mountain region. The author has also received Historical Book Awards from the NC Society of Historians for Carolina Belle, one of the new 6 books in the church library.

Other books titles are Falling Off a Cliff, In the Shadows of Chimney Rock, The Wind in the Woods, Dancing on Rocks, and Render Unto the Valley. Carolina Belle is actually a love story about apples and apple growers of Henderson County. Falling Off a Cliff is the story of a public health nurse, and is a testimony to the caring skills of traveling nurses who traveled by horseback in our mountains. Ask Lorri Spangler about this book as she knows the nurse who is portrayed!

These are amazing novels and might be exactly the books you want to read this summer. Find them displayed in the library by the fireplace for easy checkout.

### Local Outreach: Rescue Mission

The Hendersonville Rescue Mission was established in 1992 as a lighthouse for men, women, and children. It is a Christ-centered program to see broken lives transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit as they share the hope of the risen Savior. The Rescue Mission is one of the mission partners supported by Hendersonville Presbyterian Church. The organization welcomes volunteers for various roles in the mission.

Services include a homeless shelter, recovery program, counseling and teaching, the serving of three meals a day, clothing distribution, and a welcome center to provide access to telephones, restrooms, and showers.

The average stay of clients is 14 days. Over 30,000 individuals have been provided shelter over the 44 years. The Rescue Mission operates solely by private donations and grants. It is certified from Citygate (formerly the Association of Gospel Rescue Missions), which is an international association which recognizes rescue missions that have demonstrated a high quality of service to their communities through well-managed programs and operations.

We rehearse on Wednesday nights from 5:30-7:00 pm and welcome all singers from ages 15-100+!


As an added benefit, did you know that the latest research confirms that singing in a choir is great for your health?

We already know that it is refreshing to the spirit, but studies have shown that choral singing improves your mental health, as it has been shown to elevate your mood and decrease stress, depression and anxiety. These effects are believed to be attributed to the deeper breathing associated with singing, much like the kind that is used in meditation.

In addition to all of this, your physical health is also impacted for the better: lower blood pressure, increased blood oxygen saturation, elevated immunity, higher pain thresholds, stronger respiratory muscles, and it has been shown that singing can even lessen stuttering.

#### Have I convinced you yet?

Won't you come and make a "joyful noise" with us as we lead the congregation in worship? I hope to see you at our *Open House* or Wednesday nights in August.
