

### A MID-SUMMER'S NIGHT...UPDATE

Summer is in full swing! Families are traveling to and fro. Guests are visiting. People are relocating. And God is still at work right here in Henderson County, right here at HPC, right here in your life and mine.

As I write this, I am finishing an amazing tour of Greece, following in the footsteps of the Apostle Paul. We have been to Philippi and stood where Lydia was confronted with the Gospel, surrendered, and was baptized. She helped plant a church in Philippi and later planted another one in her hometown of Thyatira.

We stood outside the prison where Paul was held when he sang praise to God in Philippi. It is easy to understand why the jailer would have thought everyone was gone when the door opened up due to the move of the Holy Spirit. We stood before the platform Paul would have been brought to in Corinth, when they were trying to arrest him for the Gospel. This was a city that had the Temple of Aphrodite which employed 1000 temple prostitutes. To "Corinthianize" was a phrase which meant you were partaking in sexual immorality. And yet, the Gospel was at work there.

We travelled to Ancient Ephesus, and saw the lasting impact of the Gospel at work in such a key place in the first century. We visited Berea where the intellectual believers took what they heard preached and held it up to the plumbline of Scripture. We visited Rhodes where Titus was placed in charge of a congregation there, sharing the Good News of Jesus with people coming to port from trade ships.

On this trip, I was reminded that our country and our culture is becoming more and more and more like the culture of the 1st Century, and we need to take note of the power of the Holy Spirit at work here in our midst so we have the power and courage to share Jesus with others, as we seek to transform the culture and our country.

Gone are the days where we can look to politics to support and encourage the Church. Gone are the days where we can expect to receive favor from the local community. Gone are the days when people will show up because you have a church on every corner.

The time has come once again to do things we have not had to do in the 172 year history of HPC. The time has come once again to build authentic community within the Body of Christ, to become outwardly focused - seeking to reach those who don't know Jesus as well as those who have walked away from the institutional Church. The time has come to BE THE CHURCH - the called out and sent people of God, whose primary responsibility is to Worship God, and our primary Mission is to Evangelize the World! We have to reach one more for Jesus!

The next section is *Poetry in Wisdom*. A beautifully illustrated book, "Songs from Green Pastures," features selections from Psalms. For instance, Psalm 27:

"You are God's poem, chosen into the family of God, and you are a child of the King." Pastor Rob McClelland

"the Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear."

These words from our pastor brought to mind the two poetry sections in the church library.

The first section, *Poetry in Art*, contains a beautiful poetry book by Helen Steiner Rice, "Somebody Loves You". It shows her mastery of words to capture human emotions by writing about faith, love, family, friendship. There is a personal focus and understanding.

Another lovely book is "As I Have Loved You" by Ronald Schlegel. His poems are a collection of some of his favorites which convey the Christian message of God. Jill and Stuart Briscoe give their insight for each Psalm. Jan Karon also has a poetry book, "Patches of Godlight", which has many quotes of famous sayings like, "Whatever you would do, begin it. Boldness has courage, genius, and magic in it", quoting Goethe.

Another is, "There are three stages in the work of God: impossible, difficult, and done", by James Hudson Taylor, English Missionary.

These books along with many other titles make up two interesting sections of the library. Take a look, you may find an inspiring poetry book to enjoy!
