Pastor Letter Continued...

Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ.

Never give up meeting together as some are in the habit of doing... Serve one another!

When we value Christian Community, we make it a priority to do life together outside of Sunday mornings.

And when that happens, we see the health of the church grow, the maturity of the disciples in the church grow, and the love shared within the Body of Christ and with those outside the Body grow. Christian Community is a place for conversation, study, mentoring, and mutual love and growth to take place. It helps us individually and as the Church to grow deep faith roots so that when challenges, trials, or storms come our way, we will not be knocked around, or tossed to and fro. It protects us from false teaching. And as Paul writes to the church in Ephesus, it reveals the "fullness of Christ."

This summer, take some time to invest in building more intentional Christian Community into your life. It will be a blessing and will prepare you for eternity within the Body of Christ!



Library News

It is so interesting to read about the lives of famous people and the lives of those you would like to know more about. The biography shelf is full of such books!

No church library is complete without a book about Billy Graham. Written by Franklin Graham, Through My Father's Eyes is the book that reflects on the tremendous life of Billy Graham. It talks about how he touched the lives of millions of people worldwide through his ministry. Filled with photographs, this book is a must read.

Next, The Heavenly Man is the story of Chinese Christian Brother Yun. It is a dramatic story of how God took a young poor village boy and how he became a house church leader in China. He suffered torture and imprisonment for his faith. He visited our church some years ago and gave his testimony to a packed sanctuary! This is definitely a good book to check out.

Next are 2 books about Corrie Ten Boom. The Prison Letters, an autobiography, shows how she endured being imprisoned in Scheveningen after arrest in Holland for helping Dutch Jews during WW2. Her whole family was arrested and confined, even in solitary confinement. Next she was sent to a concentration camp with her sister and they gave comfort to each other and other prisoners. Read this book for a firsthand account of WW2. The second book about Corrie is The Lives She Touched, by Joan Winmill Brown. This book is a testimony to Jesus in her life and how nothing evil in this life can conquer us. There are many post war pictures of Corrie's travels in this book.

The final book this time is about a devout Muslim encountering Christianity, Seeking Allah, Finding Jesus. It has won the Christian Book Award and gives a look into a loving Muslim home. The family discovers evidence that Jesus rose from the dead and claimed to be God. There were struggles and inner turmoil, which face Christians, Muslims, and all those who study the world's great religions. This book is thought provoking.

I hope many of you will enjoy the library and visit often to check out one or more of our fine collection of 4000 books.
