The 2023-24 school year will begin Sept 5th with students returning to the building for another fun year of learning. Children will be learning academic skills like counting, colors, letters, and phonetics, along with social skills, controlling emotions, and sharing.

For many of these tiny humans, this is the first time that they have left their parents' side to learn with someone new and to experience friendship with those outside of their immediate family. They will hear daily about how God has made them special and how He loves each one of them. They will spend the year growing and learning as they play.

Children in preschool learn to develop social skills and self-regulation. Preschool provides opportunities to learn how to make friends, cooperate, listen, and build foundational conversation skills. When children play with their peers, there will almost inevitably be minor conflicts that bring frustration, anger, and other emotional challenges. Our teachers encourage the children to notice how their behavior impacts others and practice interpersonal problemsolving skills. Preschool graduates leave class with emotional skills they will carry with them for the rest of their lives.
