### AUGUST UPDATE



#### When the World Acts Like the World.

On Friday night, July 26, I was in the air returning home from the Dominican Republic with our youth mission team. I woke up to a flurry of texts and emails concerning the opening ceremonies of the Olympics the night before, and the mocking of God which took place on international television. I began researching and I can honestly say, I was offended, appalled and frustrated by what took place. I went to the Lord in prayer and asked how to respond to this incident. Below is what I feel God was encouraging me to say in response.

The actual scene that was being portrayed in the ceremony was titled, "La Cene Sur un Scene sur la Seine" - or translated to English - "The Last Supper on the stage on the river Seine." It was done with drag queens depicting the disciples, and then placed the Greek god, Dionysis, in the center of the table as a play on the idea of the god of wine sitting where the cup of salvation would have been. It was done in such bad taste. But sometimes art is done in bad taste. This was not the first time the "Last Supper" picture was parodied. It has been done on the Simpsons TV show and by Star Wars. Why mock or satirize Jesus in a country that supposedly has "moved past" Christianity?

A friend, Matthew Loftus, shared this thought: "After hundreds of years of subverting Christianity, Christ is still an object of fascination and beauty. Trying to live without Him requires a constant, active rejection because not thinking about Him is impossible." His fingerprints are all over creation, art, medicine, education, philosophy, religion, etc. His love is still inviting. His grace is Irresistible. His compassion is relentless. He is Jesus!

Why are we so surprised when the World looks and acts like the World? Why are we surprised when non-Christians act like non-Christians?

What if rather than getting worked up and offended, we responded by leveraging this controversy as witness to the irresistible draw of Christ? What if we took a minute to repent of making an icon of Da Vinci's art, and remember that "The Last Supper" is not sacred. The Lord's Supper IS sacred, and those two are very different. What if we remembered that Jesus, at the very supper in question, ate with sinners - someone who would betray him, someone who would deny him, and 10 others whose sin would be forgiven after dinner, while he was on the cross, and they could not see it or understand it then? And we rush to be offended by those who don't understand it or can't see it now. What if we respond by inviting people to see Jesus, the one they are drawn to while actively trying to reject him?










# Back on Track Addiction Ministry

One of the ministries supported by HPC is Back on Track Addiction Ministry. They offer help for those struggling with addiction and their families, and help to navigate the road to recovery and healing. Their mission is to provide no cost service, education and guidance to facilitate recovery and aftercare. Inspired by the overdose death of their son, Michael, at age 36, Lynette and Larry Oliver founded the ministry in July of 2020 with the opening of their Resale Store to help fund this cause.

#### **Back on Track Services include:**

- No Cost Fees and Transportation to Detox and/or Rehab Programs,
  - Transitional Housing, Airport, Bus Terminals etc.
- OnTrack Insurance Assistance Program for uninsured clients who require mental and substance abuse help.
  - Advocacy and coordination of services with attorneys, court, jail and issues within the legal system.
- Onsite classes, Recovery Support, Family Support Group, Teens on Track Support Class, Bible Study, Leadership Training, Spanish Speaking Class.
  - Providing blankets, clothing, personal hygiene, daily food bags for our area's homeless population.

Free hot meals are served every Monday on site.

The unique Retail Store offers donated furniture, clothing, antiques, jewelry, electronics, and other items, and it provides funding to help this ministry. Our church can help with individual donations, old clothing, high protein items from Sam's Club or other retailers to fill food bags.

# **Good News Clubs**

This has been an explosive year for Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF) and our Good News Clubs (GNC). We ended the 2023-24 school year with 21 clubs. We are set to start the Fall of '24 with a total of 25 clubs! If you are impressed with stats, pay attention, because since January 2024, we have had 113 people volunteer and over 1000 children attend clubs with 163 receiving salvation and/or affirming their relationship with Jesus.

Our CEF volunteers have continued during the summer by presenting 5-Day Clubs at childcare centers, churches, and backyard settings. Here at HPC, our GNC team joined with church members to hold a 5-Day Club/VBS from June 3rd -7th. We drew children from 2 elementary schools, our own congregation, and the surrounding area. The Gospel was personally shared with many children, and one child received Jesus as Savior. What a productive week!

Are you wondering how you can be involved in this ministry?

Pray for our Henderson County Schools. Pray specifically for openings in the 5 remaining elementary schools that don't yet have a club.

Outside of club, volunteer to become part of our prayer network, provide weekly snacks, prepare take-home bags, or compile attendance and parent data documents.

If you wish to attend club, help to lead songs and/or games, teach a Bible story or verse, sit with children, or take attendance. We will provide training on Saturday, August 17th, 9 am-5 pm.

#### **Library News**



# OCC NEWS:

This month our focus is on school supplies like pencil sharpeners, crayons, erasers, small or medium note pads, or spiral notebooks. Remember no company/product or military-type logos please, and no liquids.

The money collected July 21 during Pennies for Shoeboxes is used to offset the \$10/box shipping cost and the Greatest Gift Gospel booklets, collection center and processing costs, training in local churches, and the Ministry Partner Guide.

Shoebox gifts are a Gospel opportunity. For example, in a remote region of southern Madagascar, parents are giving their children wooden rifles to play with and training them at a young age to perpetuate the hostility that has raged for generations.

Pastor Soja is a local Christian leader who is working with OCC ministry partners in the area to introduce the eternal hope of the Gospel. During one outreach event, many in the crowd—which included parents—raised their hands indicating that they wanted to receive Christ as their Savior. Pastor Soja is now helping to start new churches in several villages that were once hostile to the Gospel.
